- Estimated Annual Cost for FDK in CSD \$1 million

 - Before and After School Care


Options to be Considered

- 1. Kindergarten & Early Childhood Education Program
- 2. Half Day Kindergarten Program Four Year Old Preschool
- 3. Combination of Half Day and Full Day Kindergarten
- 4. 6 hour Kindergarten with 45 minute Childcare

5. Full Day Kindergarten

- Create Four Year Old Half Day Preschool Program
- Two half days Preschool at ADS, CMS, BMS
- Four half days Preschool at MBS



Half Day K Program - 4 Year Old Preschool


- Increase Costs to support Preschool Personnel


Combination Half Day and Full Day Kindergarten

6 hour Kindergarten, 45 Minute Childcare

- 7:45am 1:45pm is our Kindergarten Day
 - Increase the Kindergarten Teachers to Full-Time
- 1:45pm 2:30pm Childcare at Each School
 - Contract Service for Childcare for remaining 45 minutes



6 hour Kindergarten, 45 Minute Childcare

- Teacher Salary/Benefits, M5/Family Health \$91,000
- Childcare Provider \$50,000 per 150 students

Full-Day Kindergarten

- Provide Full-Day Kindergarten for All Students
- Potential Impact to Specialists' Teachers Schedules
- Commitment to the Research in Program Development
- Focus on Developmentally Appropriate Practices
- Balance of Physical, Social, Intellectual, Emotional Skills

- Furniture, Supplies, Equipment 165,000

OPTIONS	Positive Connections for our Young Learners	Challenges for our Young Learners
½ Day Kindergarten & Early Childhood	Supports kindergarten students who need more instruction, supports preschool programs	Does not support all kindergarten students
½ Day Kindergarten & Preschool	Supports significant development of preschool programs	Does not add any time for kindergarten students
½ Day and Full Day Kindergarten	Many students would have full-day option	Would create a difference between kindergarten experiences
6 hour Kindergarten, w/Childcare	Virtually provides full day of programming for kindergarten	Change in staff may be challenging
Full Day Kindergarten	Provides full day kindergarten – equal access experience for all five year olds	Can be a long day for some young learners

Other Considerations

- Tuition for Full Day Kindergarten
- Creating Options for Kindergarten Specials
- Costs for furniture, equipment and supplies +\$210,000
- Educational Assistants costs are somewhat unknown
- Title I Funds may be available to support Preschool
- Transportation will need to be assessed

10 Signs of a Good Kindergarten

- 1. Children are playing and working with materials or other children.
- 2. Children have access to various activities throughout the day.
- 3. Teachers work with individual children, small groups, and the whole class.
- 4. The classroom is decorated with children's original work.
- 5. Children learn numbers and the alphabet in the context of everyday experiences.
- 6. Children work on projects and have at least one hour to play and explore.
- 7. Children have an opportunity to play outside every day that weather permits.
- 8. Teachers read books to children throughout the day.
- 9. Curriculum is adapted and differentiated for all students.
- 10. Children look forward to school and feel safe at school. Children are happy.
